Day 1: Australia ✈ Hanoi

Fly to Hanoi via connecting cities. On arrival at Noi Bai International Airport, you will be welcomed by your guide and driver who will bring you to your hotel in **Hanoi City** to rest up for the tour ahead. Hanoi is over 1000 years old and is currently the capital of Vietnam, as well the commercial, political, and cultural heart of the country.

Day 2: Hanoi City Tour (B, L)

We will pick you up at your hotel and drive to the historic Ba Dinh complex, to visit **Ba Dinh Square**, where the former President Ho Chi Minh read Viet Nam's Declaration of Independence on 2 September 1945, after almost a century of domination by France. Visit **Ho Chi Minh's Mausoleum** (just to visit Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum from outside if your visit is on Mondays & Fridays as it's closed and from 5th September to 5th November due to the annual maintenance), as well as **One-Pillar Pagoda**, a must-see monument in Ha Noi. One-Pillar Pagoda is an ancient Buddhist pagoda built in the early 11th century during the reign of King Ly Thai Tong. The pagoda resembles a lotus blossom and gets its name from its lone support pillar. Next, we will visit the **Temple of Literature**, the first university for the sons of mandarins (high government officials), for an overview of Hanoi culture and appreciation for ancient Vietnamese architecture. You will have lunch at a local restaurant, then visit the infamous Hoa Lo prison - known as **'the Hanoi Hilton'** during the American War. Those incarcerated at Hoa Lo included Pete Peterson, who later became the first US Ambassador to a unified Vietnam in 1995, and Senator John McCain, the Republican nominee for the US presidency in 2008. Then we will take a cyclo (pedicab) ride around the '36 meandering streets' of **Hanoi's Old Quarter** stopping to visit historic Tran Quoc Pagoda and Quan Thanh Temple before returning to the hotel.

Optional activity (at your own expense), **Hanoi Foodie tour**: Meet your guide at the hotel, and walk through the bustling old quarter as your guide tells you about the various foods on offer - stop and try some if you like! Then we will stop at a 'Bia hoi' store, sit down and share a relaxing moment with locals. At night, the sidewalks are full of pop-up restaurants which offer truly local food like Banh Cuon (rice rolls with pork and herbs inside), and many kinds of noodle dish. For dinner, you will enjoy Southern beef-noodles in Hang Dieu street. End the night with a drink at a local coffee shop. At here you can spend a little time to talk about life in Vietnam before heading back to your hotel.

Day 3: Hanoi 🚗 Halong Bay (B, L, D)

Travel by coach to **Halong Bay** and take a **boat trip** to explore one of the world's great natural wonders, cruising the thousands of limestone islands filled with caves of all shapes and sizes. The sails of junks and sampans gliding along the clear and emerald waters of the bay form a magnificent picturesque scene that blends with the sky. You also get a chance to visit some of the hidden grottoes beneath the towering cliffs. A **seafood lunch and dinner** will be served on board the charming junk. Stay overnight on board.

Day 4: Halong Bay 🚗 Hanoi ✈ Da Nang 🚗 Hoi An (B, L)

Enjoy the aquamarine waters of the bay at its best as the junk continues to cruise quietly through spectacular limestone formations. Disembark from the junk at noon and transfer to Hanoi airport for a short flight to **Da Nang**. On arrival, you will be picked up and transferred to **Hoi An**, an ancient town recognised as a World Cultural Heritage site by UNESCO. Check into your hotel and enjoy free time at your own leisure to discover the city.

Day 5: Hoi An (B)

You will be escorted by our local guide to **discover Hoi An** by walking tour through the narrow streets of this charming town. Perhaps more than any other place in Vietnam, Hoi An retains the feel of centuries past. Once known as Faifo, Hoi An was an influential port along the Silk Road. For over 500 years merchants from China, Japan, France, and Portugal settled in the prosperous town resulting in a distinctive blend of culture, cuisine, religions and architecture. In 1999, the town was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site listed for having the most unique architecture in Southeast Asia. It has been restored extensively over the following years. The afternoon is free at your own leisure. You may also take an optional tour, and/or attend a show in the evening (at your own expense).

1. Half-day cycling tour from Hoi An to Tra Que Village; Take a scenic bicycle ride through the rice paddies to Tra Que Village just outside Hoi An. This little village is well-known for supplying the many restaurants and hotels in the area with fresh herbs and vegetables. You will walk through the vegetable gardens, experience how the local farmers work the land and learn more about the history of the village and the importance of herbs in Vietnamese medicine and cuisine, before your relaxing pedal back to town.

2. Fishing Village & Waterway Eco-tour; Enjoy an authentic social and cultural insight into the local Vietnamese way of life. Drive to a local farming village traveling along picturesque country roads. Explore the now tranquil coconut-palm flanked waterways of a past war and hear of the extreme conditions endured by soldiers on both sides. Meet local fishermen and experience their daily life. You will take a wooden boat to a 'water coconut forest', and join local fishermen on the river to experience round net and cast net fishing. Learn to paddle bamboo basket boats and join in a basket boat race. You'll also learn how to use reeds or palm leaves to make grasshoppers, birds, rings, sunglasses, etc. Return to the boat to enjoy lunch and a cold beer or soft drink and then return the hotel by car.

3. Hoi An Impression Theme Park - The Hoi An Memories show; The Hoi An Memories show is a colourful and musically dazzling night show, with a cast of nearly 500 performers, recalls the history of Hoi An as a prosperous trading port for over 400 years. The theatre uses the waters of the Hoai River as a 25,000 sq.m stage along with state-of-the-art lighting technology and sophisticated sound effects. More than 100 girls in Ao dai (Vietnamese traditional long dress) portray the beauty of Vietnamese women and the lives of Hoi An's locals.

Note: Only one of options 1 and 2 may be selected. Option 3 may be combined with either of these daytime tours.

Day 6: Hoi An 🚗 Da Nang (B)

Today you are free to explore **Hoi An** until your coach transfer to Da Nang. On arrival, check in to your hotel and enjoy the rest of the day free at leisure, or take the following optional tour (at your own expense).

Half-day Danang City tour; Meet your guide at the hotel and transfer to visit The Marble Mountains which is a cluster of five marble and limestone mountains which are named after the five elements and is a popular sightseeing location in Da Nang because of its alluring beauty. Stone steps carved into the mountain lead to a Buddhist Pagoda. You can also discover stunning caves and enjoy the beautiful view from the top of the mountain. Next, visit Am Phu Cave where there's a model of a traditional 'heaven and hell'. The Marble Mountains are also home to Non Nuoc Stone Carving Village, which is a unique 200+ year old craft village situated at the foot of the Marble Mountains, famous for its fine art stone engravings. Then, head north to visit the Son Tra Peninsula. Here, at 693 meters above sea level, we will pay a visit to Linh Ung Pagoda – one of the most significant pagodas in Da Nang in both scale and architectural style.

Day 7: Da Nang 🚗 Hue (B)

Today you will drive from Danang to **Hue City** stopping along the way to take pictures at **Lang Co Beach**. On arrival, check into your hotel and enjoy free time at leisure. Hue City, during the Nguyen Dynasty (1802 – 1945), was the political, economic and cultural capital of Vietnam and its historical monuments were recognised as a World Cultural Heritage Site by UNESCO since 1993. One of the largest battles of the Vietnamese revolutionary war was fought in Hue, as part of the 1968 'Tet Offensive' that turned the tide of the war against the US-backed Republic of Vietnam. On arrival, you will take a boat trip to **Thien Mu Pagoda** – an historic pagoda on the banks of the Perfume River. Apart from the scenic riverside and hilltop location, the Thien Mu Pagoda and its environs are rich in history, standing witness to almost four hundred years of tumultuous nation-building in Vietnam. Transfer back to the centre of Hue city to visit the massive **Kinh Thanh Citadel**, the most well-known and iconic site in Hue, a sprawling complex within 2.5 km of walls, comprised of the **Imperial City**, several museums, lakes, and lovely gardens, all laid out in a series of concentric circles. We also visit **Hue Royal Antiques Museum** – a collection of ornaments from the Nguyen Dynasty. Finally, drive to visit **Khai Dinh Tomb** (or Tu Duc Tomb) before returning to your hotel. Optional activity; Enjoy a sumptuous **Royal Dinner** (at your own expense, four people minimum). Dress in beautiful traditional clothes (provided by the restaurant) and be served dishes which used to be made for the royal family, and enjoy live music during dinner.

Day 8: Hue ✈ Ho Chi Minh City (B)

We transfer to Hue Airport to catch a morning flight to **Ho Chi Minh City**. On arrival at Tan Son Nhat Airport in Ho Chi Minh City, you are picked up for transfer to the city centre to visit the imposing **Dong Khoi Street** (formerly Catinat street) before going to the **Notre Dame Cathedral**. This is the most famous landmark in Vietnam, as the twin bell towers can be seen from a great distance. In the same square is the famous **Saigon Post Office**, the largest functioning post office in Vietnam. Continue on to visit **Reunification Palace**, the palace of the presidents of South Vietnam before 1975, and the **War Remains Museum**, where you can learn about the Vietnam War. At the end of the day, visit **Ben Thanh Market** before returning to your hotel, after which you are free at leisure, or may join an optional (at your own expense) **Dinner Cruise** on Saigon River.

Day 9: Ho Chi Minh City 🚗 Mekong Delta (B, L)

Depart with our guide and driver for a scenic drive through the **Mekong Delta**, home to the richest agricultural lands in Vietnam. On arrival at My Tho City, take a boat trip on the Mekong River to fishing villages and **Dragon, Unicorn, Turtle and Phoenix Islands**. Crossing the **Mekong River**, you'll cruise along a small canal to see the daily life of locals in **Bến Tre Province**, visiting Quói An bee farm and handicraft workshop to enjoy some honey-tea and see how people make things from coconut wood. Take a horse-cart along country roads to visit fruit orchards, enjoy tropical fruit and listen to traditional music. Then, take small sampans back to your cruise to '**Coconut Village**' for a coconut candy workshop and tasting. Visit **Phoenix Island** for a rice-paper workshop, then return by boat to My Tho by road back to Ho Chi Minh City. Enjoy the rest of the day free at leisure.

Day 10: Ho Chi Minh City 🚗 Cu Chi Tunnels (B)

After breakfast, we visit the amazing **Cu Chi Tunnels**, a well-known historical vestige of the Vietnamese revolution. This cobweb-like tunnel complex is a network of underground dug-outs over 200 km long, consisting of many layers and turnings with meeting, living, and fighting quarters where we learn firsthand how the Viet Cong survived their extraordinary underground existence during the Vietnam War.

Day 11: Ho Chi Minh City ✈ Australia (B)

After breakfast, you will be transferred to the airport for your return flight home.

Day 12: Australia

Arrive home this morning.

Optional Post-Tour Extension

Angkor Adventure 4 Days

The Khmer empire was based around a vast network of temples and reservoirs around today's Siem Reap town. 'Angkor' is the name now given to the city, and Angkor Wat is its most famous attraction. The name translates as 'Temple of the Capital', and it is composed of as much stone as the pyramid of Cheops in Egypt. It is decorated throughout with intricate carvings of Hindu cosmology and Khmer history. Yuan-dynasty diplomat Zhou Daguan, who resided in Angkor from 1296-97 wrote that the wealth of the city rivalled that of imperial China. Having survived centuries buried by jungle, and the years of terror under the Khmer Rouge, the temples of Angkor are now one of the world's great tourist attractions.

Day 11: Ho Chi Minh City ✈ Siem Reap (B)

Fly to Siem Reap. Your expert guide will meet you and transfer you privately to your hotel. Enjoy the rest of the day free at leisure. This is your opportunity to experience (optional at your own expense) the world-renowned **Phare Circus**, where young local dancers and acrobats enact Khmer folk tales and modern stories. Developed by the charity Phare Ponleu Selpak, this performance expresses the history, challenges, and resilience of the people of Cambodia.

Day 12: Angkor Ancient City Tour (B)

Today you will visit the largest, best preserved, and most religiously significant of the Angkor temples. **Angkor Thom** covers an area of 10 square km. Enclosed by a wall and wide moats, the city includes many of Angkor's most popular sights. Enter by the monumental **South Gate** over a causeway lined on either side by statues of demons and gods, each carrying a giant *naga* (a mythical serpent symbolising the transition from the mundane to the sacred world). Continue to the **Terrace of the Elephants** and the **Terrace of the Leper King**, former spaces for public ceremonies that are both adorned with dramatic bas-relief carvings. Visit the ruined **Baphuon, Royal Enclosure and Phimeanakas**, before continuing to the mysterious **Bayon Temple**. In this temple, one of the most popular and compelling in Angkor, explore the galleries of beautifully preserved bas-reliefs and ascend narrow stairs to reach the central sanctuary, where giant stone Buddha faces smile enigmatically down from every angle. Visit **Ta Prohm** temple, one of the most popular attractions of Angkor as much of the jungle has not been cleared and it looks very much as most of the Angkor monuments would have appeared when European explorers first stumbled across them. Continue your visit to **Angkor Wat**, the Crown Jewel of Khmer architecture. Angkor Wat is the national symbol and the highlight of any visit to Cambodia.

Day 13: Siem Reap 🚢 Kompong Kleang 🚢 Siem Reap (B, L)

After breakfast, you will be transferred to **Kompong Kleang floating village**. This is a settlement of over 20,000 people where houses tower up to ten meters above the water. Greeted by waves of the friendly locals, here you can glimpse Cambodia's rural culture and traditional family lifestyle through a nice boat trip. Enjoy a picnic lunch with the locals in Kompong Kleang, then transfer back to Siem Reap and enjoy free time at leisure or for shopping.

Day 14: Depart Siem Reap ✈ (B)

Transfer to the airport for your flight home via connecting cities.

Day 15: Arrive Home

Arrive back in Australia.

Located in the Gulf of Thailand just off the coast of Cambodia & Vietnam, the heart-shaped island of Phu Quoc is rapidly becoming one of Vietnam's premier tour destinations as visitors discover the charms of its white sandy beaches and crystal clear waters. On arrival, you'll be picked up and transferred to your hotel to check in. The rest of the day is free at leisure.

Day 12: Phu Quoc Island (B)

Today you're free to explore the island's rugged jungle, striking white sand, and sparkling cobalt waters. Phu Quoc also offers varied options for fishing & diving, such as sunset fishing, night-time squid fishing, or even a camping tour. Or just have a relaxing day on the beautiful beach.

Day 13: Phu Quoc Island (B)

Enjoy the whole day at leisure for relaxing at your hotel/resort or on the beach.

Day 14: Depart Phu Quoc ✈ (B)

Enjoy the morning at leisure before checking out and transferring to the airport for your onward flight to Saigon then connecting with your flight home.

Day 15: Arrive Home

Sapa Trekking Tour Extension 4 Days

Sapa is one of the most breathtaking hill stations in Vietnam, and retains the signature of French architecture and colourful minority cultures. This is home to stunning mountain landscapes, verdant rice terraces, unique stilt villages and Fansipan 'the Roof of Indochina'. Travellers are invited to enjoy the best of Sapa as the seasons change through the year.

Day 11: Hanoi Sapa – Trek to Lao Chai – Ta Van Village (L, D)

Depart early from your hotel in Hanoi for a five hour drive to Sapa, a town in the mountainous northwest of Vietnam. Arrive **Sapa Town** with colourful traditional costumes of Hmong, Dzao, Tay ethnic people. Take a short rest and have lunch at a local restaurant. After lunch, start trekking to **Y Linh Ho** then trek through the rice terraces and along Muong Hoa stream to the **Black Hmong village of Lao Chai** to see the spectacular landscape of **Hoang Lien Son Mountain** then trek to **Ta Van village – home to the Dzay ethnic people**. This ethnic minority group possesses a rich traditional culture. On arrival in **Ta Van Village** you will have free time to discover around the village by yourself, before eating dinner with a local family, and staying overnight in a homestay. Trekking distance is about 9 km (6 miles, 4 hours trekking).

Day 12: Ta Van – Giang Ta Chai – Su Pan Village – Sapa (B, L)

Have breakfast prepared by the host family and start the new day with another fascinating trek. Walk to rice paddies where you have a nice photo session of the amazing surrounding landscapes, a trek to a beautiful waterfall and rattan bridge then take in the panorama view of **Giang Ta Chai village – home to Red Dzao people**. Trek through **Su Pan Village** to the main road, where a bus will take you back Sapa town. Check in to the hotel and enjoy free time at leisure to explore Sapa on your own. Stay overnight in Sapa.

Day 13: Depart Sapa (B)

Free to relax at your hotel or go shopping in Sapa town before your transfer back to Saigon for your flight home.

Day 14: Arrive Home

Arrive back in Australia.
